General Order Day 1 – Legislation is read in by the Sponsor

- a. ONCA 15-10, An Act to establish the Freeman Monument Fund as a revolving fund; to authorize and appropriate ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to the Freeman Monument Fund; and to establish an alternate effective date. (Supernaw)
- b. ONCA 15-26, An Act to establish a revolving fund for donations made to the Osage Nation; to authorize an appropriate donation funds for the purpose specified by the donor; and to establish an alternate effective date. (Supernaw)
- c. ONCA 15-30, An Act to prohibit the taking of eagles within the jurisdiction of the Osage Nation; and to establish an alternate effective date. (Maker)

- d. ONCA 15-31, An Act to amend 6 ONC § 5-140 to impose a mandatory civil banishment of five (5) years upon conviction for the sale, distribution, or manufacture of dangerous drugs; and to establish an alternate effective date. (Walker)
- e. ONCA 15-33, An Act to authorize and enable the creation of a Village as a political subdivision of the Osage Nation; and to establish an alternate effective date. (Walker)
- f. ONCR 15-04, A Resolution to provide for an election to amend Article IV, Section 3(G) of the Constitution of the Osage Nation. (Whitehorn)

General Order Day 3 – Amendments are voted on in the order received.

- a. ONCA 14-95, An Act to authorize and appropriate three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to the Osage Nation Higher Education Scholarship Fund from the General Treasury; and to establish an alternate effective date. (Edwards)

9. Bills and Resolutions on Second Reading

- a. ONCA 15-21, An Act to amend Chapter 3 of Title 26, the Osage Nation Revenue and Taxation Act, to allow for 100% disabled veterans to receive a sales tax exemption and a lodging tax exemption; and to establish an alternate effective date. (Norris)
